Continuous driving in one spell	5 ¹ / ₂ hours (330 Minutes)	5 1/2 hours (330 minutes) – call iBus at 270 & 300 minutes per driving spell
Total driving in a day	10 hours (600 minutes)	9 ½ hours (570 minutes) – call iBus at 540 minutes
Total hours worked in a day	16 hours (960 minutes)	14 hours (840 minutes)
Consecutive days worked	13 days & then 24 hours rest	13 days & then 1 whole calendar days rest
Rest between duties	10 hours (600 minutes) (can be reduced 3 times per week)	10 hours minimum

This route joins the areas of Belmont and Malden Manor via Sutton, and the total trip duration is approximately 70 minutes, it has in excess of 45 stops and is roughly 12 miles in length. The route has been in operation for an age and its 30th year in operation will be celebrated during April 2025. It's a lovely route however has some extremely tight turns, so concentration is paramount at all times.

This is the 2nd route win for Beddington in recent times, the previous one being the route 404 which launched in October 2023, we also retained some other routes. This is testament of the hard work that everyone at Beddington puts in on a daily basis and the great service that we provide.

One handed driving is **NOT ACCEPTABLE** and will not be tolerated.


If you use one hand while being assessed you will automatically be scored a box 3A or above.



Royal Marsden Hospital

A high volume of pedestrians, moving cars and reversing ambulances. Look out for pedestrians crossing from behind ambulances and in between cars. Be extremely mindful of cars and pedestrians in your blind spots. Good observation and appropriate use of speed are essential at this location. High risk of pedestrian strikes. Care and caution when approaching and leaving this location.

Banstead Road

High volume of traffic especially in peak times. There is a school located here which poses the issue of school children walking out between parked vehicles. The layout of this roundabout will require forward planning, due to cars approaching from your right-hand blind spot. Risk of pedestrian strikes, therefore observation is required with the appropriate use of speed at this location.

Solution:

The road is very narrow road under the bridge and 2 vehicles will not be able to pass each other. The bus stop has a pedestrian refuge island positioned at the rear of the stop, so care and caution is needed when serving this location. It is a very busy junction with cars trying to overtake the bus whilst it is serving the stop. This is a residential area and vehicles are regularly parked on both sides of the road, proceed slowly and plan ahead

- Practice due care and attention
- See More Forward Planning
- Forward planning and observation is crucial in this area



Cambridge Road / Banstead Road



This road has a traffic Island, this along with the risk of badly parked vehicles on both sides of the road poses a risk of collisions. Please be aware and proceed with care and caution due to the high curb and wall, on a blind bend. Turning should be taken with slowly while full observation is taken and mirrors are checked frequently.

- Proceed with caution
- Ensure that you have enough clearance when turning
- Appropriate use of speed, mirrors and blind spot checks is crucial to reduce the risk of collisions with vehicles and street furniture

Carshalton Road

This area is very busy with traffic and a high volume of school children. There is a possibility of children walking out from the side road. Risk of pedestrian strikes and collisions with street furniture when serving this bus stop. Care and caution required when travelling along this road, whilst keeping speed to a minimum.

- Reduce speed and keep to a minimum
- Practice due care and attention
- See More Forward planning be aware of everything around you
- See Mirror Ensure mirrors and blind spot checks are carried out frequently



Carshalton Road / Cambridge Road



Risk of collision with street furniture when turning in to Cambridge Road, take the turn extremely slowly. There are blind spots situated along this road with the possibility of oncoming vehicles in the middle of the road.



The pictured corner should be taken extremely wide to avoid contact with street furniture.

Solution:

- Reduce speed and keep to a minimum
- Practice due care and attention
- See Mirror Ensure mirror checks are done regularly
- See More Forward planning be aware of everything around you

West Street

There is a blind bend, and this is an extremely narrow road, therefore approach with caution. There is risk of mirror strikes due to the near side bushes and trees hanging into the road.



Be prepared for oncoming vehicles approaching in the middle of the road

- Reduce speed and keep to a minimum
- Practice due care and attention
- See Mirror ensure mirror checks are done regularly
- See More Forward planning be aware of everything around you

Lower Road / Lind Road



Extreme care and caution is required when turning into Lind Road from Lower Road please approach slowly. The pedestrian crossing is at the junction of a

tight bend followed by a narrow road, therefore the turning should be taken at a slow speed and forward planning is required.

Solution:

- · Appropriate use of speed
- See More Full observations including blind spot checks
- See More Forward planning is crucial in this area so be aware of everything around you

Stayton Road

Over hanging trees and parked vehicles on both sides of the road at this location. Risk of tree, street furniture along with vehicle strikes. Care and caution is paramount when proceeding along this road.

- · Appropriate use of speed
- See More Full Observations including blind spot checks
- See More Forward planning is crucial in this area so be aware of everything around you



Windsor Avenue

Extreme care and caution is required when travelling on Windsor Road. High risk of tree and street furniture strikes.




Turning should be taken at a slow speed while full observation is carried out. Mirrors should be checked frequently.

Solution:

- · Appropriate use of speed
- See More Full observations including blind spot checks
- See More Forward planning is crucial in this area so be aware of everything round you

Henley Avenue

Risk of street furniture strikes as in the picture below. Cars are parked on both sides of the road therefore proceed with caution.





- Appropriate use of speed
- See More Full observations including blind spot checks
- See More Forward planning is crucial in this area so be aware of everything around you

Sainsburys (North Cheam)

Pedestrian crossing. Proceed at a slow pace making sure to observe the blind spot (to the right of the crossing) where pedestrians may just step out without looking. Low speed is necessary, and the limit is set to 10 MPH. Risk of pedestrian strike and reversing vehicles.



- Reduce speed drastically and keep to a minimum with in the whole Sainsburys car park
- Practice due care and attention
- See More Forward planning be aware of everything around you especially pedestrians, abandoned trollevs and reversing vehicles.





Dorchester Road

Width restriction, proceed with care. Mirror checks must be undertaken whilst proceeding through due to the risk of striking the bollards on both sides.



- Appropriate use of speed
- See More Full observations including blind spot checks
- See More Forward planning is crucial in this area so be aware of bollards either side of you



Light Running

Beddington Depot to Belmont station

- Beddington Cross
- Turn left onto Beddington Lane
- Turn right onto Croydon Road
- Ahead at 'Wallington Green', onto Acre Lane
- · Ahead at Carshalton High Street, onto Pond Street
- · Right at traffic lights on to Carshalton Road
- · Continue Carshalton Road to Sutton one-way system
- Sutton one-way system, turn left onto Sutton High Street
- · Continue straight on to Brighton Road
- Turn Left into Belmont Station.



Light Running

Beddington Depot to Malden Manor

- Beddington Cross
- Turn left onto Beddington Lane
- Turn right onto Croydon Road
- Ahead at 'Wallington Green' onto Acre Lane
- · Ahead at Carshalton High Street, onto Pond Street
- Traffic lights, turn right on to Carshalton Road
- Continue Carshalton Road to Sutton one-way system
- · Continue round one-way system, Left on to Cheam Road
- · Roundabouts continue straight on to Cheam Road
- · Traffic lights continue straight on to Cheam High Street
- · Traffic lights Turn right on to the Broadway
- Continue Malden Road
- · Traffic lights continue straight on to Cheam Common Road
- · Continue onto Central Road
- Continue Malden Road
- Traffic lights at Worcester Park station continue and first left on to The Manor Drive
- Roundabout right onto The Manor Drive
- Roundabout right on to The Manor Drive
- Roundabout Continue straight on to Manor Drive North
- Bus stand and alighting point, opposite Malden Manor Station



Curtailment Points

Sainsburys North Cheam



From London Road, left into Sainsbury's, drop off and pick up bus stop (L), right London Road, line of route

Sutton Train Station



From cedar road right, drop off Sutton Station bus stop (P) on Brighton Road, circumnavigate Sutton one way system, pick up Sutton train station bus stop (O), line of route

Points of Interest

- Allow 3 seconds before you close your doors (identify more passengers who are looking to get on your bus.
- Allow 3 seconds before you depart (look around using your mirrors)

Curtailment Points

Royal Marsden



From Downes road, right in to Royal Marsden hospital, drop off and pick up bus stop (L), left on to Downes road, line of route

Sutton Marshalls Road



Drop off Sutton police station bus stop (K), left on to Sutton one way system pick up Grove road bus stop (R) line of route

Operational Consideration

The route S3 navigates round narrow and lane restricted roads. During winter periods the hilled areas can become slippery with a build-up of black ice. The performance of the route as measured by TFL and is classed as a 'low frequency route' with a minimum performance standard of 'departing on time – no less than 82%'. Drivers should be aware that this would translate to your bus not running any more than 2 minutes early or 5 minutes late (within reason).
